



Social Action for Manpower Creation - SAMPARC is a non-profit making Public Charitable Society and Trust in India, established in the year 1990 for the rehabilitation, care and educational development of orphan children, children of socially victimised women and all other needy, poor and disadvantaged children, youth and women.

SAMPARC is working in the States of Maharashtra, Rajasthan, West Bengal and Uttar Pradesh. SAMPARC imparts service in the field of child care, education and rehabilitation through Children's Home for orphan, Education to poor and needy children through Community Education Support Program, Skill development for rural school dropouts through Industrial Training and Vocational Training program to make them employable and running Schools, Junior College with hostel facility for poor, rural & tribal students for their education minimum up to 12th std. SAMPARC runs Medical Centre at Malavli Centre & Mobile Medical Unit for 25 villages in Maval Taluka for the rural poor; SAMPARC is working for Women empowerment programme and Entrepreneurship development activities for income generation for rural women; development of Tribal families through Livelihood support program and education support program to tribal children and Counselling services to children and women.

SAMPARC has completed 29 Years of service towards the care, protection and rehabilitation of the Orphan & Needy Children. Today in the State of Maharashtra SAMPARC Children's Home for orphan children is rated best Shelter Home for the children. As a result, all Child Welfare Committees (CWC) of respective districts chooses to send maximum number of children to SAMPARC for better care, protection, and development. As a result maximum number of children are referred to SAMPARC Children's Home by the concern authority.

The unique part of SAMPARC Child care program is that from the date of admission the organisation takes care of the children till they are not rehabilitated properly. Till today, about 160 girls are married and more than 700 boys and girls are employed in various places in India and abroad.

SAMPARC Children's Home, Bhaje now has 150 girls whereas SAMPARC receives grant for 110 children. SAMPARC is persuading the Government for increasing the grant based on total number of Children living in the Children's Home. The organisation faces challenge when new children of age group 12 to 16 are admitted with the order from CWC. Many of them are victims of abuse and are traumatized because of their past experience. The Counsellors, house-mothers and other staff take a lot of pain to comfort and normalize the children. Similar problem is handled when children come to SAMPARC Children's Home at Bal Asha Ghar, Shel-Pimpalgaon and Poynad centres. Many children - boys and girls were exposed to sex business, illegal activities in the slums and in the family at a tender age. It is challenging for SAMPARC staff to handle such children to work on their better mental health, education and lifestyle. Many of the children come for poor background and fail to start education and lead a healthy life.

But we are glad to mention that, our trained staff tackle the problems of the children and try to provide them good environment, confidence and trust. Some of the very sensitive issues of the children were handled by Trustee Mrs Ratna Banerjee herself with the help of Mr Paresh Khadilkar – Chief Psychologist, Mrs Vindhya Bapat - Dy. Project Director, Medical Team of SAMPARC and trained staff of Balgram.

Mr Paresh Khadilkar – Chief Psychologist of SAMPARC is coordinating with 165 grown up children who are attending college, various technical institutes and training program in industries. Periodical get-together, alumni meet with the senior children, visiting their institutes keeps the program interactive for the senior children to coordinate their needs. Regular guidance for their higher education and employment is treated with utmost importance.

SAMPARC Centres always try to instil Value Education in children through leadership and personality development trainings of the children by eminent experts. Sports training, cultural activities and drawing, painting classes are conducted for the children through coaches, trainers and teachers of the respective trades. Children are also exposed to community education which guide them to become responsible to the environment, cleanliness, sanitation, hygiene etc. SAMPARC believes in growth of the children under community umbrella.

More than 96% results was achieved for 10th std and 12th std education and all the successful boys and girls have opted for higher education.

To improve the standard of work of the personnel involved with the children, they were imparted intensive training throughout the year by Miracle Foundation India. Emphasis was given on 'Right of the Children' 'Best Health Support', necessary education aid and opportunity, drinking water, nutrition, and to create friendly atmosphere.

This year 3 classroom and one reception room were constructed at Bhaje Centre which has made the place more attractive for the resident children. Thanks to our all donors. At the end of the year we have started excavation for Well which is expected to be operational in the next 3 months.

We are very optimistic about the success of our two sports instructors who are busy training two teams of girls in athletics and wrestling. Our children from tribal school at Bhambarde represent Netball at the National Level. Yoga Program by children of Children's Home, Shel-Pimpalgaon and Taekwondo by children of Bal Asha Ghar are of High standard.

SAMPARC Children's' Home Shel-Pimpalgaon have added solar power for the entire centre which has helped in power efficiency. Thanks to our donors.

We must acknowledge that the SAMPARC Industrial and Vocational Training Institute at Malavli has made it possible to provide training to 750 boys and girls this year. More than 500 children have become computer literate this year. The new building facility and introduction of two new two year courses Fitter and Electrician for boys have improved the Vocational Training and Industrial training program of Maval Taluka. This has become successful because of financial support from our donors.

The Education support program for the rural and tribal children in Bhambarde School up to 12th std. is doing excellent in studies. The tribal Katkari children are the prime focus area of the program where children from 360 Katkari families are now supported for education. Our social workers are not only emphasizing on education but also regularly interacting with each family, counselling them and helping in developing livelihood project for the Katkari families. Bhambarde School is acting on transforming the lives and values of the Western part of Mulshi Taluka touching the lives of more than 10,000 families.

A phenomenal change has come in the life of the villagers with epicentre in this school. In a similar manner our Abhinav English Medium School in Patan is doing very good to impart English Medium education to the low income group families of surrounding villages in Maval Taluka. We have made a successful effort in starting Lily English Medium School for the students who completed 5th std. at Abhinav English Medium School and are able to join 6th std. at SAMPARC Lily English Medium School at Malavli Centre which is located at the centre of 40 villages. SAMPARC Lily English Medium School provide education support up to 12th std.

From the initial days SAMPARC is involved with village women for village empowerment program where we are closely associated with 6000 women of Self-Help Group (Bachat Gat) and Patpedhi i.e. Women's Credit Cooperative Bank. This year we organised 4 training programs for the women's group and various meetings at village level. We also run Family Counselling Centre with the help of Women's Commission.

SAMPARC has conducted volunteers support program from various corporates where one of the program was to promote Environment Conservation through tree plantation. Various volunteers painted the building, conducted cleanliness drive, and spent time with the children to impart various knowledge. SAMPARC in association with the women's group and Government of Maharashtra was trying for tripartite agreement towards bigger afforestation program in Maval Taluka which could not materialise due to lack of permission from the concerned authority.

This year we have worked in 7 schools in Mulshi Taluka on Right to Education. It has been a remarkable support to the schools and children in improving their quality of education. About 600 students are benefited through the program and more than 150 families got awareness about need for educating the children.

SAMPARC believes in advocacy for child development through knowledge sharing, especially for the right of the children along with other NGOs working for the cause of children. SAMPARC has developed a good working knowledge on Juvenile Justice Act and thus it shared about the act and its application in the interest of the children. Training program was also held in SAMPARC by the Maharashtra State Child Right Commission in Malavli Centre.

Since 2016, SAMPARC started awareness building on its nearby caves and monuments to empower rural community to draw global attention. SAMPARC believes that supporting conservation, care and protection all these nearby caves and forts need special attention which enhance children and scheduled society to grow their responsibility towards the Heritage Monuments. This year SAMPARC organised SAMPARC Heritage Walk on 28th Nov 2018 where more than 6000 people from nearby places joined to support Heritage Monuments and to enlist all these Heritage Monuments Bhaje, Karla, Bedase Caves and Visapur, Lohagad Forts in the UNESCO Heritage List. Through this program SAMPARC also created its awareness about the organisation and its activities in a big way.

SAMPARC always stresses on fulfilment of the statutory requirement. The organisation regularly furnishes its Annual and Accounts reports to the Charity Commissioner, Financial report to the FCRA Authority, Finance Ministry, Department of Women and Child Development. Apart from that, monthly and quarterly reports are sent to all donors, funding agencies, CWC, WCD along with the progress report. This year Session Judge of District Court visited SAMPARC Children's Home to check out the wellbeing of the children.

SAMPARC Shel-Pimpalgaon has also improved its activities. All the children have scored good marks and all students passed the 10th std. Specialty of the Centre is Yoga. Similarly, SAMPARC Poynad Centre is doing well in studies. 7 children in 10 std, 3 children in 12th std. and 3 children in Final Year Graduation passed the examinations.

SAMPARC Jodhpur Centre known as Kalyanmal Kevalmal Balakashram has done tremendous progress and is now well equipped with computer and other education facilities. SAMPARC Kolkata Centre is also doing excellent and all the children are progressing in education properly.

SAMPARC started Vocational Training Programme at Varanasi in UP. Land is procured and building is being constructed for developing Vocational Training program in Computer, Tailoring, Retail Sales, Spoken English and Life Skill Development along with Community Education Support Program.

SAMPARC Rural Community Education support programme is another way of reaching poor rural and slum children to get better opportunity for education Development. By this programme SAMPARC provides them education, stationery, nutrition, special coaching and counselling to the parents to support the education of the underprivileged children. To support this programme this year SAMPARC helped Dhananjaypur rural community in South 24 Parganas, West Bengal to get fabricated classroom so that children can sit properly even in the monsoon. SAMPARC also is running a Centre at Mandir Bazar near to Dhananjaypur.

This year in Kolkata SAMPARC carried out two activities in the name of SAMPARC Shanti Kolkata project for 90 slum children of Tollygaunj area and SAMPARC Behala Project for children of Behala area. SAMPARC also runs two community education programme for Santhal tribal children at Rahimpur and Gultia in Hooghly District.

SAMPARC has Education support programme in Jodhpur at village Gangani where children were supported for special education programme. SAMPARC also carried Education Support Programme for 200 girls in Maval and Mulshi Taluka in the district of Pune under Nanhi Kali Project supported by K C Mahindra Trust. The programme is now stopped. SAMPARC needs support for running the programme for 200 rural girls under education support programme.

**Future Plan:** SAMPARC believes, by empowering its staffs who would be instrumental in propagating need of the society, especially to the weaker section. This will enable us to move ahead with our own means for resource mobilization. SAMPARC is developing Social media as a Tool to reach to the masses and share the activities of the organisation and to participate with the various programmes to create awareness about the SAMPARC and its work.

SAMPARC has decided to power up entire SAMPARC Balgram Bhaje through solar energy.

To accommodate students up to 12th std. SAMPARC has plans to develop one more floor to provide 14 classrooms (including Science faculty for 11th and 12th std.) in Malayli Centre. Similarly, SAMPARC has plans to enhance one floor of Youth Hostel to accommodate more participants who come to SAMPARC Malayli for various training programmes.

**SAMPARC Governing Council:** Governing Council is the highest decision making body of SAMPARC represented by all Trustees of SAMPARC. SAMPARC Governing council approves each and every activity of the organisation. This year 4 governing Council Meeting and one Annual General Body Meeting were conducted. In the meeting the new President and New Trustee were selected. Our former President Mrs Pushpa Singhvi passed away this year.



**SAMPARC LOCAL LEVEL MANAGING COMMITTEE:** SAMPARC is taking help of Local Level Managing Committee, to supervise care and protection of children. The LLMC Members are entrusted to review living condition of children in each home. We are trying to take more people with the background of law, Psychology and Social Work as Members of Local Level Managing Committee. LLMC Members are scheduled to meet at least 6 times in a year.

Like previous years, in the month of February 2019, our Italian friends and team of Homeopathy doctor, examined health of all children of SAMPARC Children's Home in Maharashtra; the children received medicines and treatment as per their problem.

SAMPARC is thankful to Fondazione Belladonna Onlus and IPSOS Foundation which has supported to procure land and helped in the construction of Vocational Training Centre at Varnasi.

SAMPARC Children's home, for the care of orphan, poor, needy and disadvantaged girl children is situated at the footstep of famous Bhaje Caves, 10Km from Lonavala.

The Children's home was started with 7 orphan children and Mr. Amitkumar Banerjee and Mrs. Lata Pande laid the foundation of the organization in a mud house in the year 1990 at the footsteps of famous Bhaje Caves near Lonavla. SAMPARC Children's Home, Bhaje is licensed under the Department of Women & Child Welfare, Government of Maharashtra.

The children's upbringing and education is in a family environment of care and protection of Project Incharge, Counsellor, House Mothers and Tutors who work with the children under guidance and help of Mrs. Ratna Banerjee, Trustee and Coordinator of the Project.

SAMPARC is monitoring overall progress of these children and providing education support. 02 children have now completed 18 years but still under SAMPARC care and planning for their rehabilitation.

SAMPARC has now completed the construction of 4200 sq.ft. new building comprising of 5 classrooms, 2 staff rooms and separate toilets & bathrooms. Also the classrooms and office are equipped with necessary furniture. SAMPARC started 2 courses Fashion Design and Computer from June 24th 2019.



Fashion Designing Course- 15 Sewing Machines -13 Paddle Sewing Machine and 2 Umbrella Sewing Machine (Full) are installed for Basic & Advance Fashion Designing Course. 14 students have enrolled for Fashion Design Course. The duration of the course will be for 3 months.

**Computer Course-** 21 Computers are installed and 6 students have enrolled for Computer Course. The duration of the course will be for 3 months.

32 inches monitor and laptop for Spoken English Audio-Visuals Classroom has been purchased.

Mass Level Awareness Drive was conducted in nearby villages - Badagaon, Kudi, Chilbila, Bairampur, Basni, Tikli, Shivala, Jamalpur by Posters and Flex along with announcement to create awareness so that students can take admission in the courses. SAMPARC medical Centre provides its services through OPD, IPD, Dental, Pediatric, Medical Mobile Clinic, Dermatology & Pathology, X-Ray department to cater to the needs of the rural poor patients. Also the Centre organizes regular health & awareness camps to the rural poor by doctors from Pune and Mumbai who are specialized in their respective fields. The Centre also takes care of medical needs, immunizations & Vaccinations of the children of SAMPARC Children's Home, Bhaje and Bal Asha Ghar.

SAMPARC Medical Centre provides medical support through following departments under the guidance of Medical Director Dr. Satish Patil, M.S, LLB, LLM.

During the period **April 2018 to March 2019 - 10369** patients were treated through following departments of SAMPARC Medical Center.



### **OPD AND IPD:**

The OPD department has provided treatment to **1475 patients** and IPD department has provided treatment to **190 patients**. The patients receive treatment by Dr.Shruti Satish Patil, MBBS and she is assisted by Nurse.

### **DENTAL DEPARTMENT**

Dentist Dr. Ms. Neha Dubey, BDS provides dental treatment to patients and Dental department treated **1309 patients**.

### PAEDIATRIC DEPARTMENT

 On 2nd & 3rd May 2018, 5 Patients who were diagnosed with cataract problem in the Eye camp held on 12th and 13th December 2017, at SAMPARC Medical Centre by Ruchika Club, Mumbai underwent cataract operation, conducted by Dr.Kulin Kothari-MBBS, DOMS, MS in Ophthalmology & Dr. Sonia Kothari-MBBS, Dip.in Ophthalmology.

## ENT & JAIPUR LIMB FOOT CAMP BY RUCHIKA CLUB, MUMBAI

- On 14th, 15th and 16th, December 2017- ENT & Jaipur LIMB Foot camp was organized at SAMPARC Children's Home, Shel-Pimpalgaon by Ruchika Club, Mumbai.
- The ENT camp was conducted by Dr Prakash Golecha-MBBS, MS-ENT Specialist and Dr Kanan Golecha and 466 patients benefitted from the same.
- 140 patients were examined by Dr. Vyas from Jaipur Foot organization **Bhagwan Mahaveer Viklang Sahayata Samiti** and according to the requirement clutches, Clippers, wheel tri chair and other supporting things were distributed for the beneficiaries who were from economically weaker class of the society to help them to stand on their legs and to walk.

### HEALTH CAMPS FOR RURAL STUDENTS OF MAVAL TALUKA

 During the period 2018-19, SAMPARC doctor Dr.Vijay Sutrave conducted 18 General Health Check-up camps for the benefit of 249 students of Z.P.School of Village Pimpoli, Mundaware, Lohagad, Gherewadi, Takwe, Devale, Sadapur and 149 students of Abhinav English Medium School & Lily English Medium School & Junior College.

SAMPARC doctors conducted 2 General Health Checkup camps for 405 students of VPS College, Lonavla and Valven College, Lonavala.

HB Test of 32 students & staff of Z.P.School, Sadapur village was conducted by SAMPARC Pathologist Mr.Dhananjay.









# SAMPARC TRIBAL DEVELOPMENT PROJECT

For development of poor, Katakari children and Katakari families SAMPARC under Tribal Development Project is working in 54 villages and providing Livelihood support and Education support to their children to create socio-economic development of the Community. 547 Katkari children are enrolled in different schools in Mulshi Taluka and 382 Katkari families are supported under Livelihood programme.



### **EDUCATION SUPPORT**

Among 547 tribal children - 436 children are enrolled in 45 Zilla Parishad Primary schools and 111 are enrolled in SAMPARC School and Hostel at Bhambarde. Out of these children, 64 Tribal children are stepping the school door step for first time and enrolled as per their age in respective class under RTE.

- Academic progress of the tribal students is progressive up to 5 to 8 % every year. Now children want to complete their education and they dream to have a proper academic career which will shape their future.
- SAMPARC Team conducted regular Home visits and Counseling of Parents to ensure that children attend school regularly and continue their education. Attendance percentage of students has increased up to 89%.
- Life skill sessions were conducted for tribal students to develop good habits, etiquette,

  manners and to present themselves properly individually and as group. This has helped to
  develop their personality, self-confidence which in turn has increased participation of tribal

students in all academic activities organized to explore themselves. They are also performing well in Sports, computers and extra-curricular activities.

### LIVELIHOOD SUPPORT:

During the period 2018-2019, under Livelihood programme 100 families have received livelihood support. SAMPARC Team is now working with 382 Katkari families, (i.e. 282 families supported during previous years with additional 100 families this year).

- Livelihood support has helped to reduce Migration of tribal families tremendously. This in turn has positively helped their children who are able to attend school regularly. No. of school drop outs has reduced drastically. Tribal parents have settled in villages now.
- This year SAMPARC Team has covered 100 beneficiaries to provide livelihood support like
  fishing net for fishery, Minishops -general house hold store, sewing Machine, Dholpathak
  instruments for Groups, Sound system and Wedding Decoration material for Group.
- As per our survey and records monitored, Income level through livelihood support helped to raise 20 to 30 % as compared to previous expenses carried by tribals routine lifestyle. The additional financial income is utilized for domestic purpose exclusively.





### **DOCUMENTATION:**

- Since 2014, SAMPARC Team is working with tribal families, to get recognition for tribal existence and due to continuous follow up and efforts of SAMPARC team the tribal families have proper documents which will help them in future to get Government benefit.
- 186 tribal beneficiaries have Ration Card, 467 tribal family Members have Aadhar Card, 263 beneficiaries have Jan Dhan Bank Account, 332 beneficiaries have Voter Id, and 181 tribal beneficiaries have Caste Certificate and still 70 new proposals of caste certificates for beneficiaries are in process. Our documentation work has given the identification and recognition of the tribal existence and total 1313 beneficiaries/Members of Tribal Families under support have received the benefit and are enjoying the facility received.

### **HEALTH:**

- Dr.Vijay Bhujbal resident Doctor of SAMPARC School & Hostel, Bhambarde conducts regular
  visit to all tribal hamlets at three clusters namely Bhambarde, Ambavane and Paud of
  Project area. Tribals families now follow the advice of doctor and are taking proper care of
  hygiene and personal care.
- De-addiction sessions are conducted regularly for tribals to quit alcohol consumption and Visual Documentary on side effects of addiction on their personal health & family have inspired youth and some tribal to quit their habits and want the next generation to be away from this vicious circle of addiction. Tribal children and community members are bathing regularly and are well dressed and wearing clean clothes.
- SAMPARC team will ensure that tribal children at SAMPARC School and hostel will never consume alcohol and will lead a healthy and prosperous life.

# SAMPARC HIGHER EDUCATION

SAMPARC Higher education Project took shape in the year 2001, when tiny tots of SAMPARC who joined SAMPARC in the year 1990 passed their 10th std SSC Board exam. Slowly the number of senior children started increasing every year and more number of children from various Children's Home of SAMPARC joined the Higher Education Project for pursuing their dreams. Every year 40-50 Senior children of SAMPARC pass SSC Exam from SAMPARC Children's Home and are added in the Higher Education Project. Meanwhile senior children continue their education under SAMPARC support and guidance for another 5 to 6 years and about 20-30 senior students complete higher education every year and get employment in different sectors and are rehabilitated. The project is working under the guidance of Higher Education Coordinator- Mr.Paresh Khadilkar, Child Psychologist, LLB. He is assisted by Mr.Ashok Jadhav, Psychologist, Ms.Sujatha Angadi, Counsellor and Mr.Dhananjay Natu.



Once a child completes schooling from SAMPARC Children's Home the higher education and career guidance of each child is planned taking into consideration results of IQ test, Aptitude test, interest of the child and available opportunities. Right from centralized admission procedure of all the children, documentation for college admission, requisite documents for bank accounts opening- like Aadhar, Pan card, Voter Id & orphan certificate- the Project provides all required guidance to the children. After admission in college, transport facility, hostel accommodations are facilitated by SAMPARC. Children are provided with necessary books, educational materials, uniforms etc and extra coaching classes are arranged as required. After admission the Counsellors monitor the progress of the students regularly through visits to the colleges where children are studying and telephonic conversation with the children.

Also the Project is in regular contact with senior girl children of SAMPARC who are now married to understand and ensure their well-being after marriage.

During the academic year 2018-19, 100 senior children of SAMPARC were pursuing Higher education and following are the details-

Children are provided with all Education and school stationary items along with nutritional food to motivate children to attend school regularly.





# SAMPARC EDUCATION SUPPORT PROGRAM IN MAVAL AND MULSHI TALUKA, DIST PUNE, MAHARASHTRA - NANHI KALI

Under this programme 200 poor and needy Girl children - 100 from Maval Taluka and 100 from Mulshi Taluka, District - Pune, Maharashtra are supported under Nanhi Kali program.

# SAMPARC EDUCATION SUPPORT PROGRAM IN VILLAGE GANGANI, IN JODHPUR, RAJASTHAN

Under this programme 60 children from Village Gangani, Jodhpur, receive education support.

SAMPARC COMMUNITY EDUCATION SUPPORT PROGRAM, WEST BENGAL - The Beneficiaries under this program are from very poor situation. Their parents work as daily wage labor or rickshaw-puller or domestic helpers or land-less farmers who work in others farms. Because of poverty, education of the Children is neglected. To help the children who are from 1st std to 10th std SAMPARC provides them nutrition and tutorial support. Children attend Government run schools and SAMPARC tutor teaches the children all subjects in the class and they also receive all educational stationery to attend school.

# Under this program 289 children receive education support and 140 children receive Computer Literacy support. Following are the details of beneficiaries

- At District Hooghly, 60 children from poor tribal families from village Rahimpur and Gultia receive education support.
- At District South 24 Parganas, 169 children from poor rural community from village Dhananjaypur, Mandir Bazar, Bahir Kancholi, and Kashi Nagar receive education support.
- At Kolkata City 60 children from Behala slum receive education support.
- 140 rural poor children receive training in computers at Kashi Nagar.

Also with the support of our Italian Friends-Insieme who are supporting this project Renovation Work of the Study-Centre at Dhananjay Pur has been completed. The classrooms are now properly fabricated and comfortable which has helped the children to a very large extent especially during the monsoon season.



The children receive nutrition and education support in the Centre. The tutors teach the children all the subjects and ensure children attend school regularly and continue their education. Children receive all educational school stationery and regular tutoring to improve them in studies. All the children attend the classes regularly and are showing good improvement in their studies.

The impact of the project has tremendous help for the families belonging to poor financial and economic conditions and also is helping children to attend school regularly.



# SAMPARC WOMEN EMPOWERMENT PROJECT

Since 1992, SAMPARC is working for the upliftment of rural women of 12 villages of Maval Taluka, District Pune by imparting various training programs to enhance the capacity, create awareness about various schemes of Government, about Rights of Women, conducting income generation programs to rural women which have helped them to become independent. SAMPARC started the concept of Self Help Group (SHG) and subsequently a Registered Co-operative Society was formed. Today,140 SHGs of SAMPARC received "A grade" as per the criteria laid down by Central Government National Rural Jivanunatti Campaign.



Following are the various activities undertaken by SAMPARC for development of Rural Women-

Training to SHG Women

Shri. Mahesh Patil, Taluka Co-ordinator from Guidance Centre- Central Government National Rural Jivanunatti Campaign & Umed on behalf of SAMPARC and Panchayat Samiti, Vadgaon conducted training program for SHG women on SHG record maintenance and SHG Govt. Schemes.

Awareness about Government Schemes undertaken by SAMPARC

SAMPARC conducted awareness program about Central Government National Rural Jivanunatti Campaign and submitted proposal to Vadgaon Panchayat Samiti and 50 SHG groups received rotating fund of Rs.15,000/-

Asmita Yojna, Women and Child Welfare Department, Government of Maharashtra SAMPARC coordinated this campaign and under this scheme 24 SHG's from 12 villages were registered and received the benefit to start a Sanitary Napkin unit.

# ZILLA PARISHAD YOJNA

36 women this year have received the benefit through this scheme-they received 2-Flour mills, 1 beauty parlour chair, 2 sewai machine, 5 sewing machines and 26 girls received refund of fees from Government for undertaking computer training.

# INCOME GENERATION PROJECT TO NEEDY SHG WOMEN, MAVAL BLOCK, PUNE.

With the support received from Cargill India & United Way of Bengaluru Rs.5000/- each was distributed to 32 needy women beneficiaries to support them in Income Generation Activity from Village Bhaje, Lohagad- Gherewadi, Karla, Pimploli of Taluka Maval, District Pune, Maharashtra. The selected beneficiaries are from the SHG groups of the respective villages. The support has helped them to start small enterprise like Tailoring, Tea stall, Vadapav center, Snack center, Mini Shop (Kirana Store), Beauty Parlor, small hotel, Fruit & Panipuri stall.

All the beneficiaries are working hard to expand their enterprises and are very happy to be able to support their family. More beneficiaries will be added under this program and they will receive the benefit from revolving fund.

## LIVELIHOOD SUPPORT PROGRAM 5 VILLAGES OF AMBEGAON BLOCK, PUNE

SAMPARC in partnership with AFARM, Pune is working for development of 2000 women by providing Livelihood support. Under this project SAMPARC formed 69 Production Groups of Women under 5 Gram sanghs of 5 villages- Pargaon, Thugaon, Karegaon, Bavdi and Kurwandi in Ambegaon Block. Training programs were conducted for women on Income generation, marketing of products, digital banking, dairy farming, goat farming and poultry.

Today, in these 5 villages 75 Women Entrepreneurs are working independently in the fields of-Diary, Poultry, Goat farming, Organic farming, making paper plates, making potato chips making animal feed and preparing various Masalas. Also the women beneficiaries were provided under Government scheme- a mini tractor, chilli powder grinding machine, machine for making animal feed and potato chips machine.

## SAMPARC FAMILY COUNSELLING CENTRE

SAMPARC Counselling Centre is recognized by Maharashtra State Commission for Women. The Counsellor Ms. Sujata Angadi works as District co-coordinator for Pune District. The Centre functions as a service/resource provider for women to solve domestic problems. The Centre receives cases from State Commission for Women, Community people and through Police Station (Wadgaon, Kamshet & Lonavla).

During the period April 2018-March 2019, 27 new cases were registered at the centre, 17 cases are ongoing and 27 old cases have been resolved by the centre. Individual Counselling, Joint session, Family counselling and Legal advice are the tools used to solve problems. The Counsellor conducted 14 home visits, 165 Individual sessions, 34 joint sessions, 33 couple counselling sessions, 34 family counseling sessions, 65 legal guidance sessions and 177 sessions of Emotional support.



The Counsellor of the centre visit various villages to create awareness about Domestic Violence, Women's Rights & other issues related to women & their respective families and Women's law.

• During the period the counsellor conducted Women Rights Awareness campaign for women at village Kuravande- 23 rural women benefitted from the same.

• The counselor conducted workshop for women on the subject Women Empowerment and Health at village Devale & Ambegaon 60 women benefitted from the same.

The Counsellor with the purpose to solve the cases is in regular touch with local Police stations, Government offices, attends and conducts meetings to create awareness about the services of the Centre –

- The counsellor attended meeting as a committee member of women complaint redresser committee under The Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013 at MSEDCL, Pune and Treasury Office, Pune and worked on 2 cases at MSEDCL.
- The Counselor visited Women and Child Development Department, Pune for coordinating between Mahila Aayog and WCWD for "Jansunavani" program conducted by Mahila Aayog. 36 cases were registered on this day.
- The Counselor attended Meeting at ICDS, Vadgaon with Protection Officer regarding on going case in court and developing referral system for counseling of victim, defenseless and destitute women.
- The Counselor visited Legal aid department to meet Adv. Mrs. Jadhav to discuss case no.344 which was filed in the Court under Domestic Violence Act 2005.
- The counselor attended Legal Aid meeting at Yerwada Mental Hospital, Pune with Judge Mr. Pathan regarding rehabilitation of recovered women patient.

SAMPARC Counsellor Mr.Ashok Jadhav is working under the guidance of Shri Paresh Khadilkar, Child Psychologist, LLB. The Centre is working for the mental wellbeing of all children of SAMPARC Children's Home and students studying in SAMPARC Schools in SAMPARC Grameen Vidya Vikas Kendra, Bhambarde, SAMPARC Abhinav English Medium School and Lily Englsih Medium School & Junior College. The Counsellor also conducts life skill session and career guidance to senior children of SAMPARC for higher education.

The Centre along with Counselling services provides Psychological Assessments, Interest Inventory, Aptitude Test and IQ Test.The Counsellor helps in identifying any learning difficulties of the children and helps them in understanding their study skill.



The counsellor from the Centre provides regular support to social workers working in SAMPARC Children's Home, in Maharashtra. The Counsellors train the teachers and the Project counsellor working with the children to address child related issues and needs of the children.

During the period 2018-19, the Centre conducted 89 Individual Counselling sessions and 15 group guidance sessions for children of SAMPARC Children's Home, Bhaje, Poynad, Shel-Pimpalgaon, Bal Asha Ghar. Group Guidance sessions were conducted on following topics-Building trust in a relationship, Building a Counseling relationship, Anger Management, Teenage Issues and Guidance Time Management, Planning and Goal Setting, Life Skill Education, Personality Development, Adolescent issues and guidance and Confidence Building.


