

Mr. Anil Singhvi- President, SAMPARC and Mr. Amitkumar Banerjee-Founder / Secretary, SAMPARC are pleased to present the Annual Report of SAMPARC organization for the period 2024-25.



We are pleased to share that SAMPARC has made remarkable progress this year, successfully achieving its goals and completing

various tasks aligned with the organization's mission.

SAMPARC has significantly strengthened its efforts in the care and development of orphaned children across its various centres. The organization continues to ensure the holistic growth of children through focused initiatives in education, skill development, health awareness, and preventive healthcare.



Today, SAMPARC is widely recognized across Maharashtra and PAN India for its dedicated work with orphaned and underprivileged children. Its core mission is to support the development of children, youth, and women, enabling them to lead stable and self-reliant lives. The organization is deeply committed to investing its resources in the welfare of its beneficiaries and creating a sustainable impact.

SAMPARC Programs Highlights in Maharashtra, West Bengal, Rajasthan and Uttar Pradesh:

Child Development: SAMPARC runs Children's Homes for orphaned and underprivileged children - SAMPARC Balgram Bhaje, SAMPARC Bal Asha Ghar,

SAMPARC Balgram Shel-Pimpalgaon, SAMPARC Balgram Poynad in the Pune and Raigad districts of Maharashtra and SAMPARC Shishu Kendra in Kolkata, West Bengal and SAMPARC Balgram Jodhpur in Rajasthan. This year, a total of 457 children - 343 children across SAMPARC's Children's Homes and 114 senior children received support to pursue higher education, ensuring continued academic growth beyond school.





07 children were employed this year, and 03 Senior girls from SAMPARC have been selected for admission to the course at NUSI Maritime Academy, Goa. They will receive placement in the Merchant Navy after successful completion of the Course and training.



Educational Development: During this Period, SAMPARC extended School Education support to 878 students through two schools with junior colleges and one hostel. Lily English Medium School & Junior College (Nursery to 12th Std) in Malavli, Maval Block, Pune District and SAMPARC Grameen Vidya Vikas Kendra (5th to 12th Std, Marathi medium) with hostel facility in Bhambarde, Mulshi Block, Pune District.

These Schools & Junior colleges aim to offer holistic education and a nurturing environment to help children excel academically and personally.

SAMPARC runs the Community Education Support Program for 616 children in West Bengal, Uttar Pradesh, and Rajasthan.

Children are provided free tuition in key subjects like Maths, English, Science, and Social Workers ensure children attend school and complete their school education.





Skill Development: SAMPARC Industrial & Vocational Training Institute, Malavli, Maval Block, Pune District. Through the Skill Development Program in Maharashtra, 654 students- 114 ITI Students, 147 VTC Students and 393 MKCL students were given skill training and ITI students got job placement in various companies such as Larsen & Toubro, Tata Motors, JSW Pvt. Ltd. Through SAMPARC Vocational Training Institute in Uttar Pradesh, 111 students were given skill training.



Tribal Development- an Extensive program of SAMPARC across 113 villages in Mulshi, Maval, Bhor, and Velha Talukas, Pune District. Through Tribal Development, 945 Tribal children are enrolled in various educational programs: 925 children are enrolled in Schools, and 20 tribal children are pursuing higher education. 80 families received Livelihood support. The Livelihood Support program has helped increase income levels and also helped control migration, which has subsequently led to a decrease in the number of tribal students dropping out of school. 484 tribal beneficiaries received support for necessary documentation, and 405 beneficiaries received support to avail the benefit of government schemes.





Community Health: Medical Centre, Mobile health Clinic are reaching rural patients to provide health support in 12 villages of Maval and 13 villages of Mulshi block in Pune District. This Year, 43371 rural patients received health care support through the SAMPARC Medical Centre, 3 Medical Mobile Clinics and Medical Health Camps.



Women Empowerment: 1067 women are shareholders of SAMPARC Abhinav Mahila Patsanstha (SAMPARC Abhinav Women Credit Cooperative Society).

24 new cases were received in the Family Counselling Centre for legal guidance, and women were counselled and made aware of the problem to resolve family disputes during this year. Both projects are functioning from the SAMPARC Malavli Centre, Maval Block, District Pune.

SAMPARC also carried out agricultural activities and tree plantations at the village level. Usage of Solar Energy in every Project has been ensured, and an eco-friendly approach has been adopted by means of Waste Management, Production of Bio Gas and Bio fertiliser.

Organized & hosted BALMAHOTSAV 2025 – a "3 Days Program of Sports and Co-Curricular Activities for the Children of all the Balgram of Pune District" in association with DWCD Pune in January 2025.

Key developments during the year included the strengthening of the staff structure in Human Resources Management, defining the roles and responsibilities of each individual, setting specific targets, and developing a point-based reporting system. These efforts contributed to the overall growth and improvement of the organization's operations.

SAMPARC enhanced its resource mobilization efforts at the project level, and with support from various agencies, SAMPARC successfully fulfilled its due diligence to meet the diverse needs of CSR-supporting corporations.

In time, preparing Utilization Certificates through auditors has led to a better understanding of CSR organizations, including impact analysis and the achievement of time-bound targets. SAMPARC has fulfilled all the statutory requirements of the State and Central Government.



सूर्यिकरणांची झुळूक, सावलीचा आडोसा आणि प्रकाशाची शिदोरी

"सूर्यिकरणांची झुळूक, सावलीचा आडोसा आणि प्रकाशाची शिदोरी" या तीन शब्दांत संपर्क संस्थेचा प्रवास सामावलेला आहे. १९९० मध्ये माझे पती श्री. अमितकुमार बॅनर्जी यांनी एका छोट्याशा रोपट्याला पाणी घातले आणि त्यातून आज वटवृक्ष उभा राहिला आहे. त्या वटवृक्षाच्या सावलीत असंख्य निराधार, दुःखी, विस्थापित बालकांनी आश्रय घेतला आणि आपल्या जीवनातला अंधार दूर करून प्रकाशाचा शोध घेतला. ही संस्था म्हणजे केवळ आश्रयस्थान नाही, तर मुलांच्या आयुष्यातले आईचे ममत्व, संस्कारांचा ओलावा आणि आत्मविश्वासाचा दीपस्तंभ आहे.

या प्रवासाकडे मागे वळून पाहताना मला एक विलक्षण समाधान मिळते. प्रत्येक मुलाचे बालपण इथे सुरक्षित झाले, त्यांना शिकण्याची संधी मिळाली, त्यांच्या डोळ्यांत स्वप्ने फुलली आणि त्यांच्या पायांना नवी दिशा मिळाली. या मुलांच्या चेहऱ्यावर उमटलेले हास्य हेच माझ्या आयुष्याचे खरे दागिने आहेत. संपर्क ही माझ्यासाठी नुसती संस्था नाही, तर माझ्या मातृत्वाचा विस्तार आहे. प्रत्येक बालक हा माझा स्वतःचा भाग असल्यासारखा मला वाटतो.

गेल्या महिन्यात संपर्कच्या मुलांना बेलारूस येथे सांस्कृतिक कार्यक्रमासाठी सहभागी होण्याची संधी मिळाली. परदेशी भूमीवर आपल्या भारताची संस्कृती मांडताना मुलांच्या डोळ्यांतला आत्मविश्वास आणि ओठांवरचे हसू पाहून माझे डोळे पाणावले. तो अभिमानाचा क्षण होता. त्या क्षणी माझे पती श्री. अमितकुमार बॅनर्जी यांनी रुजवलेल्या कार्याची पल्लवित झालेली फळे माझ्या डोळ्यांसमोर होती. मुलांनी केलेले ते सादरीकरण केवळ सांस्कृतिक नव्हते, तर ते भारताची ओळख, आपल्या संस्कारांचे प्रतिबिंब आणि त्यांच्या अंतःकरणात जागवलेली आत्मविश्वासाची जाणीव होती.

संपर्कच्या वाटचालीत एक नाव नेहमी माझ्या हृदयात जिवंत राहते ते म्हणजे 'खुशी' (नाव बदलले आहे). केवळ तीन वर्षांची असताना ती आपल्या दोन भावंडांसह संपर्क परिवाराचा भाग झाली. तिच्या आईने अत्यंत प्रतिकूल परिस्थितीत, कोणत्याही आधाराविना, आपल्या मुलांना वाचविण्याच्या आशेने आमच्याकडे आणले. मी सुरुवातीपासूनच पाहिले की खुशीमध्ये काहीतरी वेगळेपण आहे. तिच्या नजरेत कुतूहल होते, तिच्या बोलण्यात आत्मविश्वासाची बीजे होती. मला वाटले, या मुलीला योग्य शिक्षणाची संधी मिळाली तर ती नक्कीच काहीतरी वेगळे करू शकेल. म्हणूनच मी आमच्या इटलीच्या हितचिंतक व संपर्कच्या कुटुंबातील सदस्य लुसिला मौन्टी यांना विनंती केली. अनेक अडचणींवर मात करून मी लोणावळा येथील ऑक्सिलयम या इंग्रजी शाळेत खुशीसह संस्थेतील इतर चार मुलींना प्रवेश मिळवून दिला.

हे काम सोपे नव्हते. इंग्रजी शाळेत शिकणाऱ्या इतर मुलींसोबत वावरतांना आमच्या मुलींमध्ये न्यूनगंडाची भावना होऊ नये, त्या आत्मविश्वासाने उभ्या राहाव्यात यासाठी आम्ही खूप धडपडलो. रोज सकाळी उठवणे, शाळेत रेल्वेने नेणे-आणणे, त्यांचा नाश्ता, जेवण, शिकवणी वर्ग, इंग्रजी संभाषणाचा सराव — या सर्व गोष्टी आम्ही काटेकोरपणे राबवल्या. माझ्यासाठी हा प्रवास जणू मातृत्वाचीच दुसरी कसोटी होती.

खुशीच्या प्रगतीतून माझ्या सर्व परिश्रमांचे चीज झाले. तिच्या आईच्या डोळ्यांत चमकलेले समाधानाचे आणि कृतज्ञतेचे अश्रू मला आजही आठवतात. ती छोटी मुलगी आज युरोपातील हंगेरी येथे शिक्षण, संशोधन आणि नोकरीच्या क्षेत्रात आपले स्थान निर्माण करत आहे. तिचा हा प्रवास माझ्यासाठी विलक्षण अभिमानाचा आहे.

खरं तर खुशी ही केवळ एका मुलीची कहाणी नाही, तर संपर्कच्या कार्याची साक्ष आहे. एका लहानग्या बाळापासून ते जागतिक पातळीवर उभ्या राहिलेल्या युवतीपर्यंतचा तिचा प्रवास म्हणजे संस्थेने दिलेल्या प्रेम, शिक्षण, संस्कार आणि संधीचे मूर्तिमंत रूप आहे. आणि या प्रवासात मी केलेली धडपड आज माझ्या हृदयात कायमची जपली गेली आहे.

मुलांच्या आयुष्यातील गरज फक्त अन्न-वस्त-निवारा एवढीच मर्यादित नसते. त्यांना हव्या असतात संधी, शिकण्याची उभारी, संवादकौशल्य, कला, क्रीडा आणि संस्कारांची शिदोरी. म्हणूनच संपर्कमध्ये आम्ही इंग्रजी संभाषण, संगीत, नृत्य, योग, संस्कार वर्ग यांवर विशेष भर दिला. प्रत्येक बालकाला केवळ जगण्यासाठी नव्हे, तर उभारीसाठी तयार करणे हेच माझे ध्येय राहिले आहे. संस्थेच्या प्रवासात माझा सहभाग नेहमीच "आई"च्या भूमिकेतून राहिला. आई आपल्या लेकराला जशी प्रत्येक पावलावर आधार देते, तशीच प्रत्येक बालकाच्या पाठीशी उभे राहण्याचा मी प्रयत्न केला.

आज संपर्क संस्था ही केवळ एक आश्रयदाते नाही, तर ती आहे आईचे ममत्व, सावलीचा आडोसा आणि भविष्यातील प्रकाशाची झुळूक. या प्रवासातील प्रत्येक यशस्वी कहाणी ही माझ्यासाठी देवाने दिलेला आशीर्वाद आहे. श्री. अमितकुमार बॅनर्जी यांनी रुजवलेले रोपटे आता जीवनदायी वटवृक्ष बनले आहे, आणि त्या वटवृक्षाच्या सावलीत फुलणाऱ्या प्रत्येक मुलाचे यश हेच माझ्या आयुष्याचे खरे समाधान आहे.

माझ्या दृष्टीने संपर्क म्हणजे प्रेम, संस्कार आणि जबाबदारी यांचा सुंदर संगम आहे. आजवरचा प्रवास पाहून मी अभिमानाने सांगू राकते की ही संस्था मुलांच्या आयुष्यातील अंधार दूर करून प्रकाशाचा दीप पेटवते. पुढेही ही वाटचाल अशीच चालू राहो, मुलांना स्वावलंबी करणे, समाजात आत्मविश्वासाने उभे करणे आणि त्यांना "निराधार" या शब्दापासून मुक्त करणे — हेच संपर्कचे आणि माझे आयुष्याचे ध्येय आहे.

मुलांच्या चेहऱ्यावर उमटलेले हास्य, त्यांच्या डोळ्यांत चमकणारी स्वप्ने आणि त्यांच्या पावलांत सामावलेली भविष्याची उभारी — हेच माझ्या आयुष्याचे खरे मनोगत आहे. खरंच, या मुलांसोबतचा प्रत्येक दिवस हा सूर्यीकरणांची झुळूक, सावलीचा आडोसा आणि प्रकाशाची शिदोरी आहे.

Established in 1990, SAMPARC Children's Home, Bhaje, is a home for orphaned, poor, needy, and disadvantaged girl children. Mr. Amitkumar Banerjee, Mrs.Ratna Banerjee and Mrs. Lata Pande laid the foundation of the organization in this Centre, with 7 orphaned girls in a small mud house at the foothills of the historic Bhaje Caves, near Lonavala.



Since its humble beginnings, the Children's Home has grown into a secure and nurturing environment for many underprivileged girls, providing them with care, education, and opportunities for a brighter future. The Home operates with the license and guidelines of the Women & Child Development Department, Government of Maharashtra, ensuring compliance with child welfare norms and standards under the Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act, 2015, Act.

The children are raised and educated in a nurturing, family-like environment that emphasizes care and protection. This supportive atmosphere is created by a dedicated team comprising the Project In-Charge, Social Workers, Counsellors, House Mothers, and Tutors. They work closely with the children under the guidance and support of Mrs. Ratna Banerjee, the Founder Trustee and Coordinator of the Project.

SAMPARC Children's Home, Poynad is a home for orphan, poor and needy children from difficult situations in Raigad District, Maharashtra. The beneficiaries of SAMPARC Children's Home, Poynad are orphans, single-parent children, children of convicts serving imprisonment in jail, poor & needy children, along with some other children who are under Temporary Shelter by the Order of the Court under the POCSO Act.



In the academic year 2024-25, 42 children - girls and boys have received care & protection in SAMPARC Children's Home, Poynad. Out of 42 children, 31 attended school & college, and the remaining 11 children received admission for Temporary Shelter and under the POCSO Act.

The girls and boys live in separate accommodation for care, education, overall development and rehabilitation. The Children's upbringing is in a Family Environment of Care and Protection by Social Workers, House Mothers and Tutors who work directly with the Children under the Guidance of the Project in-charge, Mr. Vishal Saindane.



The SAMPARC Skill Development Training Centre, located near Varanasi, Uttar Pradesh, supported by the Belladonna Foundation and INSIEME Organization from Italy, empowers rural youth from Baragaon and nearby villages through vocational training. The Centre currently offers three skill-based courses: Tailoring, Beauty Parlour Course, and Computer Training. These programs aim to enhance employability and promote self-reliance among youth in the region.

The project is working under the Project In-Charge, Mr. Digvijay Singh. Following are the details of students enrolled during the Period April 2024 to March 2025-

COMPUTER COURSE:

61 students were enrolled in the CCC computer course. The CCC computer course is certified by the NIIT Foundation, New Delhi. The Computer Course helps the beneficiaries to be computer literate.



TAILORING:

18 students enrolled in the Basic & Advanced Fashion Designing Course from the Institute. The basic Course is for 3 months, and the advanced course is for 6 months, which helps them to be completely trained and employable.

BEAUTICIAN COURSE:

32 students enrolled in the course. The duration of the course is 6 months (Basic & Advanced).

To foster socio-economic development among impoverished tribal communities in Pune district, the SAMPARC Tribal Development Project provides comprehensive support, including livelihood assistance for tribal families, educational support for their children, and help in securing essential government documents such as caste certificates, AADHAAR cards, PAN cards, and ration cards.

In addition, the project actively works to connect families with various government welfare schemes, many of which they are often unaware of.

The Tribal Development Team of 10 Social Workers works under Project In-Charge Mr. Kalpesh Rokade in 113 villages across four blocks—Mulshi, Maval, Velhe, and Bhor—in Pune district.

The entire Tribal Development activities have been supported by eClerx Services Ltd. since 2014.

EDUCATION:

During the 2024-25 period, a total of 945 children were enrolled in various educational programs. This includes 925 children enrolled in 68 Z.P. primary schools, 141 tribal children attending the SAMPARC School and hostel in Bhambarde, and 20 tribal children pursuing higher education. Among these 20 children in higher education, 9 are pursuing Graduation, 10 are enrolled in technical courses, and 1 is pursuing a healthcare course.



Under the Tribal Education Support Program, children who live with their parents—and whose families do not migrate for livelihood—are enrolled in the nearest local schools. These students are provided with all the necessary educational materials to support their learning. On the other hand, those whose parents migrate for work are admitted to the SAMPARC School & Hostel in Bhambarde, ensuring continuity in their education.

All enrolled students receive educational supplies, and the SAMPARC Team maintains regular follow-ups with school teachers to monitor each child's academic progress and attendance.

During the academic year 2024-25, the Attendance Percentage of tribal students is 84.58%.

The team also engages regularly with parents, raising awareness about the importance of education in shaping a child's future. Due to the dedicated efforts of SAMPARC team since 2014, school attendance among tribal children has significantly improved, and the dropout rate has markedly declined.

Today, tribal students are not only performing well academically but are also actively participating in sports, cultural programs, computer education, and various school competitions. This transformation is a direct result of consistent community engagement. Parents, who were once unaware of the value of education, now recognize its importance and are ensuring their children attend school regularly.



LIVELIHOOD SUPPORT:

During the 2024–25 period, as part of the Livelihood Support Program, 80 tribal families received targeted support to enhance their income-generating capabilities. Currently, the SAMPARC Team is working with 922 Katkari families—including 842 families supported in previous years and an additional 80 families assisted this year.



Focusing on skill-based livelihoods, the SAMPARC Team provided a variety of tools and equipment tailored to each family's potential, such as Pico sewing machines, popcorn machines, drilling machines, fishing boats and nets, plumbing material, welding machines, mason kits, mini shops, sewing machines, flour mills, puncture repair kits, vegetable and fruit centres, and electrician toolkits, among others.

As a result of these interventions, beneficiary families experienced an average income increase of 32.06% this year. The additional income is primarily used for household needs, significantly improving the quality of life. Beneficiaries have expressed high levels of satisfaction with the support received.

One of the most significant outcomes of this program has been a notable reduction in migration. With sustainable income sources now available, tribal families have opted to settle in their native villages. This has directly influenced the school attendance of tribal children, as fewer families are compelled to migrate, leading to a significant decrease in school dropout rates.

With continuous guidance and support of the SAMPARC Team, parents are now more invested in expanding their livelihoods and ensuring a stable future for their families, while children can

continue their education without disruption.



DOCUMENTATION & LINKAGE WITH GOVT. SCHEME:The SAMPARC Team has been actively and consistently engaging with government authorities to assist tribal families in obtaining essential documentation. These documents —such as caste certificates, AADHAAR cards, and ration cards — are crucial for accessing government welfare schemes and entitlements.



Ensuring that each tribal beneficiary has the proper documentation has been a priority for the team.

Since 1992, SAMPARC has been working for the upliftment of rural women in Maval & Mulshi Taluka, Pune District, by imparting various training programs to enhance their capacity and awareness. These initiatives include awareness on government schemes, women's rights, and income-generating activities, all of which have played a vital role in helping rural women achieve independence and self-reliance.



SAMPARC ABHINAV SHG COOPERATIVE SOCIETY

SAMPARC ABHINAV SHG COOPERATIVE SOCIETY - SAMPARC started the concept of Self-Help Group (SHG) and subsequently, a Registered Co-operative Society was formed. 1167 women are shareholders of the Registered Co-Operative Society. During the period 2024-25, Rs. 20,50,000/- amount was given as a loan to 38 rural women for business & domestic purposes. Regular Meetings of shareholders of SAMPARC Abhinav Mahila Patsanstha (SAMPARC Abhinav Women Credit Cooperative Society) are held.





Digital Financial Literacy Workshop 2024
SAMPARC conducted the Digital Financial Literacy Workshop for 236 youth, women and farmers in Pargaon Memane, a village near Pune. The project aims to encourage the community to use digital tools for financial transactions and entrepreneurial activities.

SAMPARC Family Counselling Centre is recognized by the Maharashtra State Women's Commission and serves as a vital resource and support service for women facing domestic issues. The centre focuses on raising awareness about domestic violence, women's rights, and other matters concerning women and their families

The Counsellor from 1st April 2024 to 31st March 2025, worked on 37 cases, 24 new cases were registered in the Centre, 6 cases were



solved & closed, and 37 cases are ongoing and in process. Please find below details-.

Cases are referred to the centre by local police stations (from Lonavla to Talegaon), village sarpanchs, women's self-help groups, former beneficiaries, and individuals who directly approach the centre.

At the grassroots level, it conducts workshops and awareness programs on topics such as women's welfare, rights, and government schemes aimed at uplifting underprivileged



rural women. These initiatives are designed to empower women, build their confidence, and help them gain equal respect within their families and communities.

Additionally, the counsellor attends the Vadgaon Maval Court Legal Aid Cell once a week, serving as a retrial mediator to resolve filed cases. This includes handling pre-litigation matters—resolving disputes before they escalate into court proceedings—often through mediation and proper counselling. This approach saves both time and resources for all parties involved.

The counsellor also maintains regular communication with local police stations and relevant

government offices to facilitate case resolutions. Additionally, she actively organizes and participates in community meetings and outreach activities to promote awareness of the centre's services.













SAMPARC HEALTH CARE PROGRAM

SAMPARC Medical Centre is a healthcare facility operating in the rural areas of Maval and Mulshi Blocks in the Pune District. It aims to provide medical services to underprivileged individuals in these remote villages. The centre offers health services through OPD, IPD, Dental Care, Vision care, Gynaecology, Medical Mobile Clinic, and Pathology departments to cater to the medical needs of the rural poor. SAMPARC Medical Centre regularly organises health camps in collaboration with specialised doctors from Pune and Mumbai, targeting Specific Health Issues and raising awareness about health and hygiene. The centre also addresses the medical needs of children living in SAMPARC Balgram, Bhaje, Shel-Pimpalgaon, and Bal Asha Ghar. SAMPARC Medical Centre is supported by the Volkart Foundation Indian Trust.

A team of 18 staff members in Maval and Mulshi Blocks, comprising doctors, Dentists, lab technicians, optometrists, nurses, are working under the guidance of Medical Director Dr. Satish Patil, M.S., LLB, LLM.

DEPARTMENT WISE DETAILS FOR THE PERIOD 1ST APRIL 2024 TO 31ST MARCH 2025From 1st April 2024 to 31st March 2025, 43,371 rural patients received healthcare support through the SAMPARC Health Care Program. Of these, 33,832 patients were supported through the SAMPARC Medical Centre and Medical Mobile Clinic, while 9,539 patients benefited from Health Camps.

MOBILE MEDICAL CLINIC
3 Medical mobile clinics are visiting the interior villages of Maval Taluka and Mulshi District, Pune, to treat sick and ailing patients who cannot visit the hospital.

- Medical Mobile 1 Maval Block- visits 13 villages & 3 Hamlets and has treated 11545 patients from 1st April 2024 to 31st March 2025.
- Medical Mobile 2- Maval Block- visits 21 villages and 1 Hamlet and has treated 10688 patients from 1st April 2024 to 31st March 2025.
- New- Medical Mobile 3- Mulshi Block visits 13 villages and has treated 5532 patients from July 2024 to March 2025.

During this period, 27,765 patients were treated through Medical Mobile Clinics 1, 2 & 3 in Mayal and Mulshi Block of Pune District.

HIGHLIGHTS OF SAMPARC HEALTH CARE PROGRAM 2024-25

- 1. Empowering Communities Through Health Awareness and Collaboration
- **Family Planning Awareness:** The SAMPARC Medical Team has been actively involved in raising awareness about the **Family Planning Program**, especially focusing on women's health across various rural regions. The team provided invaluable education and guidance to ensure families are well-informed.
- Antenatal and Postnatal Care: During routine visits to remote areas, the SAMPARC Medical Team identified two high-risk Antenatal Care (ANC) cases and four Postnatal Care (PNC) cases. Prompt action was taken with the issuance of Garodar Mata Nondni cards to these mothers, emphasizing the critical importance of early registration and institutional deliveries. As a result, these women are now consistently attending their scheduled medical check-ups, fostering better maternal and infant health outcomes.
- Collaboration with Aasha Workers: The team conducted a comprehensive training session with Aasha Workers, strengthening community health networks and ensuring better coordination for maternal and child health services.
- Home-Based Newborn Care (HBNC): In partnership with the Asha Workers of Pimpoli village, SAMPARC facilitated HBNC visits, educating mothers on essential neonatal care practices, including the significance of breastfeeding and the appropriate duration for infant nutrition.

2. Celebrating Breastfeeding Awareness & Infant Health

- World Breastfeeding Week 5th August 2024: In recognition of World Breastfeeding Week, SAMPARC organized an educational session at Anganwadi Sadapur. The event emphasised the importance of breastfeeding, offering expert advice on techniques and positioning. The occasion also included the joyful celebration of "Aardha Varshik Vardhapan", a traditional ceremony where six-month-old infants were fed kheer for the first time. As part of this initiative, the medical team conducted growth monitoring of infants by measuring their weight and height to assess their nutritional status. Malnutrition cases were identified, and necessary interventions were implemented. Additionally, critical information regarding breast cancer awareness was shared, focusing on early detection and self-examination.
- Sahi Poshan Desh Roshan Initiative: Aligned with the government's health initiatives, SAMPARC collaborated with the Anganwadi to promote the Sahi Poshan Desh Roshan campaign, emphasizing the importance of balanced nutrition for children. Doctors and nurses educated villagers on the nutritional benefits of seasonal, locally available foods such as Shevga Shenga (for eye health), custard apple (calcium-rich), and amla (Vitamin C-rich).

To make the message more impactful, a Healthy Cooking Competition was held, with mothers showcasing nutritious and tasty dishes, reinforcing the message of healthy, home-cooked meals.

3. Immunization Drives for Preventive Health

• Japanese Encephalitis (JE) Vaccination Drive: On 21st March 2025, SAMPARC, in collaboration with Karla PHC, launched its first-ever JE vaccination camp under the National Immunization Program. The campaign successfully immunized 219 students across Pimpoli, Taje, and Boraj villages. A subsequent drive on 24th March reached 116 students in Pathan, Devale, and Sadhapur villages, marking another key milestone in preventing childhood diseases in the region.

4. Eye Care Services:

• Eye Camps - Medical Mobile Clinic 1: Through its Medical Mobile Clinic 1, SAMPARC conducted eye camps in nine selected villages, screening a total of 843 individuals. Of

- these, **462 were identified with vision impairments. 250 patients** received free spectacles, and 95 individuals were diagnosed with cataracts. With the support of **Desai Hospital** and the **SAMPARC Medical Unit, 36 cataract surgeries** were successfully performed at no cost.
- Eye Camps Medical Mobile Clinic 2: In a larger outreach effort, Medical Mobile Clinic 2 held eye camps in 18 villages, screening 1,073 patients. 800 individuals were provided with free spectacles, and 84 cataract cases were detected and referred for timely surgery.
- 5. Addressing Anaemia: A Focus on Women's Health
- Anaemia Camps L&T Mobile Unit Collaboration: SAMPARC, in partnership with the Larsen & Toubro Public Charitable Trust Mobile Unit, launched anaemia camps across 18 villages, targeting women between the ages of 16–50. A total of 1,600 haemoglobin (HB) tests were conducted, and 984 women were screened. Out of these, 167 women were identified as anaemic and received prompt treatment and ongoing care. Remarkably, follow-up tests conducted after three months revealed that 80% of these women successfully transitioned from an anaemic to a non-anaemic state, showcasing the program's effectiveness in improving women's health.

HEALTH CAMP BY RUCHIKA CLUB, MUMBAI IN ASSOCIATION WITH SAMPARC

On 14th and 15th February 2025, a Health Camp covering Eye, ENT and Gynaecology, camp was conducted by Ruchika Club, Mumbai, at SAMPARC Medical Centre, Malavli.

A total of **1689** patients benefited from the Health Camp. Following are the details for the same-

- ENT Care Unit- 410 patients benefited, and 118 patients were given Hearing Aid Machines.
 ENT check-up conducted by ENT Doctor- Dr Balaji Suraj Giri.
- EYE Care Unit- 788 patients' eye checkups were conducted 117 patients were referred to cataract surgery, and 574 patients received Spectacles. Eye check-up was conducted by the Doctors' Team from H.V. Desai Hospital, Hadapsur, Pune. SAMPARC Medical Centre conducted regular follow-up of 117 cataract patients for BP & sugar check, and after surgery, also took follow-up of patients for post precautions.
- Gynaecology Care Unit-205 Women benefited from the Gynaecology Camp, out of which 63
 women underwent a Pap smear test conducted to detect Cervical Cancer. 41 Women were
 screened for Breast Cancer by N.K.Dhabar Cancer Foundation. The Gynaecology health
 camp was conducted by Dr Ashwini Pawar, a Gynaecologist.
- Thalassemia- 245 patients were screened for Thalassemia, an inherited blood disorder where the body produces less haemoglobin than normal, leading to anaemia.
